









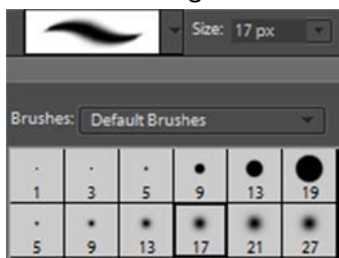


## Photoshop Elements

- Access Levels tool  
Enhance > Adjust Lighting > Levels... OR Ctrl + L
- Access Brightness/Contrast tool  
Enhance > Adjust Lighting > Brightness/Contrast...
- Access Color Correction tools  
Enhance > Auto Color Correction OR  
Enhance > Adjust Color > Remove Color Cast OR  
Enhance > Adjust Color > Color Variations
- Access Healing Brush tool  
Click on the  icon.
- Access Spot Healing Brush tool  
Right-click on the  icon, then click on the  icon.
- Access Clone Stamp tool  
Click on the  icon.
- Set up the tool to remove haze from a photo
  1. On the Layers menu, click the  icon to create a new layer.
  2. On the blending mode dropdown menu  Select 'Color Burn'.
  3. Make sure the foreground color is white: 
  4. Click the fill icon, , then click on the image.
  5. Select the  icon.
  6. Click the arrow to make the foreground color black. 
  7. Set the Opacity to between 4 and 13%
  8. Select a soft-edged brush from the Brush Preset dropdown menu.



## Terms

**Blending mode** – The way that two layers interact with each other

**Clone Stamp** – A tool that copies parts of your image and pastes it everywhere you click. Use Alt + Click to define the part of the image you want copied.

**Color Cast** – The colored tinge that a photo often takes on over time; for instance many photos from the 70s are now distinctly pink.

**Hardness** – A hard brush (e.g. 100% hardness) will have sharp edges that contain the effect you are using:  whereas a soft brush (e.g. 25% hardness) will have indistinct edges that allow the effect you're using to taper off naturally: 

**Haze** – Where a photo has faded over time or dust has collected, and a white film partly obscures part of the image.

**Healing Brush** – A tool that copies the texture of part of your image and applies it everywhere you click. Use Alt + Click to define the part of the image whose texture you want copied.

**Layers** – Similar to sheets of transparencies stacked on top of one another, allowing editing work to be done without ruining the original picture.

**Levels** – A tool that changes the brightness levels of different portions of your image, and can also correct color casts.

**Opacity/Alpha** – How transparent an effect is. For instance, a 100% opacity black paintbrush will lay solid black over your image, but a 50% opacity black paintbrush will lay a grey shading over your image that allows details of your original image to show through.

**Spot Healing Brush** – A tool that tries to fix spots on your image by replacing the spot that you click on with similar colors and textures from around that area.
